

International OECD/NEA/RWMC workshop
«Implementation of the EGIRM methodology for presenting of national RW and SF management programmes»

28 February-1 March 2017

International Workshop « Implementation of the Expert Group on Inventorying and Reporting Methodology (EGIRM) methodology for presenting of national RW and SF management programmes», organised by OECD NEA proposed to be held on 19-20 September, 2017 in NEA building, Boulogne-Billancourt, France.

Workshop objectives:

- Presentation of the methodology developed by the EGIRM as tool for presenting of national RW/SF inventories in connection with management strategy and disposal route;
- Wide discussion of the presenting scheme and methodology features and capacities;
- Demonstration of the methodology application for presenting the national RW/SF management strategies in common format (status, forecast);
- Discussion of the ways of methodology implementation.

Workshop

It is proposed to organise two-day (max) workshop. The NEA, having developed the methodology with the purpose to harmonize the RW and SF inventories reporting within the presentation of the national RW/SF management strategies and disposal routes proposes wide discussion and practical application of the methodology. The methodology will be presented by the EGIRM representatives to invited workshop participants. It is intended to invite representatives of waste management implementers, regulators, decision makers, responsible government ministries and other interested organisations from member countries. Also international organisations which are potentially interested will be invited – EC, IAEA, WNA, etc.

Four topical sessions are proposed to be held.

Sessions

4 sessions:

- • 4 hours each session + coffee breaks (session length can be various depending on its detailed programme);
- • 30 min one presentation;
- • time left of session – discussion the topic;
- • chair’s introduction (10’), 3 presentations (90’), break (20’), discussion, examples, practical testing and chair’s report (120’)
- • reporters from EGIRM in each session and presentations from participants
- • session chairs (TBD later).

Session 1: «RW/SF inventory, management strategy and disposal routes – need to harmonise reporting and presenting»

This session aims at providing an understanding why the methodology development and other relevant activities were started and what is the status of international efforts. Reporting needs for the various international programmes and benefits of a common presentation format will be discussed in the session.

Speakers potentially could be proposed of the workshop participants: EGIRM and two invited reporters (S&T initiative, IAEA, EC, ENSREG WG2, Etc.).

Session 2: «EGIRM methodology – history of development, background, EGIRM objectives, requirements to the methodology »

This session aims at providing an overview of the methodology development process, objectives achieved and requirements addressed.

Speakers potentially to be proposed of the workshop participants: EGIRM secretariat and experts.

Session 3: «The methodology in details»

This session focusses on the all details of the developed methodology explaining the role of each element of the presenting scheme with wide provision of examples. Implementation of the methodology for reporting to different programmes will be demonstrated.

Speakers potentially to be proposed of the workshop participants: EGIRM secretariat and experts, volunteers who tested the methodology.

Session 4: «Practical exercises on the methodology application on prosed examples»

This session will focus on practical exercises on the methodology application with examples of hypothetical and some national RW/SF inventories proposed by workshop organisers. The exercises will be performed by participant split up on groups. The discussion of results and analysis of performance will be held in second part of session.

Group leaders are to be proposed of the workshop participants.

Workshop language

Working language is English.

Registration

Registration is opened up to 19 September 2017.

Organisational structure

The NEA Secretariat and EGIRM members will work together for preparation of the Workshop. No additional structure is needed.
